

CHARLIE BOSWELL - ROYAL SIGNALS - POLARIS

Charlie Boswell is a former Royal Signals soldier who first attended a Mission Motorsport 'experience' day in 2014. Charlie was struggling "When I was medically discharged, I was in a bad place both mentally and physically. I found it hard to find a job that I could do, and had collapsed at work with back pain." He continued to be engaged with the charity and on establishment of the Armed Forces Engagement



Programme at Jaguar Land Rover he was one of the first veterans to be offered a work placement. At the end of the placement Charlie was offered a full time position but the nature of the work was not for him. Mission Motorsport put him forward for a role with all-terrain vehicle specialists Polaris UK as a Marketing Assistant and he is now very happily employed full time. In his words, "I absolutely love it."





INTRODUCTION

5 YEARS OF THE FORCES MOTORSPORT CHARITY

THE CHARITY IS CELEBRATING:

PACE

Sport has the power to change lives, for the better. Mission Motorsport's sporting program ranges from low level car control events, to full blown racing on two and four wheels. Used as a vocational engagement and assessment tool, the latest (2016) sporting year has engaged over 240 participants, 170 of them new to recovery motorsport. The charity's sporting output is supported by Help for Heroes and by a wide range of sponsors as part of a wider recovery sport program.



RETRAIN

- Vocational training is a key step on the transition pathway. Mission Motorsport offers a City & Guilds Level 3 Diploma as well as bespoke short courses from the Institute of the Motor Industry in light vehicle maintenance and repair.
- Three years of a unique apprenticeship in Classic Vehicle Restoration in partnership with Bicester Heritage, Banbury & Bicester College and the Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs.
- The training centre works as an accredited satellite to Tedworth House and has full City & Guilds support as part of their Corporate Social Responsibility commitment to Help for Heroes.
- Students have a choice of a range of core courses based on C&G Level 3 Diploma as well as bespoke short courses from the Institute of the Motor Industry.
- Over 90 companies have offered support to industry placement schemes, including Jaguar Land Rover, Rolls-Royce, Prodrive, Renaultsport F1 and DHL.

RECOVER

- Embedded as part of MoD's Career Transition Partnership (Assist) Employer Relationships team funded by Help for Heroes and by industry.
- Relationship Managers to the "Automotive Industry" with manufacturer programs.
- Affiliation with the Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders (SMMT) and a member of the Motorsport Industry Association (MIA).
- Helping get beneficiaries into the expanding workforce of the £71 Billion automotive and £9 Billion motorsport industries.
- A Royal British Legion funded employment initiative for non WIS veterans was launched in 2016, helping industry access service leaver and veteran talent.
- Member of The Confederation of British Service Charities, Mission Motorsport worked collaboratively with the grant giving charities to channel in excess of £90,000 in grants in 2016, helping veterans to secure financial support during transition.



Part of BattleBack's wider sporting program, Mission Motorsport provides expertise and advice to Recovery Sport output. A competent authority, developing best practice in access to motorsport for the disabled, Mission Motorsport also delivers a sporting program designed to inspire and enable participation for the widest range of beneficiaries.

Sporting output is categorised in three areas, forming a pyramid:

COMPETITION

EXPERIENCE

EXPERIENCE events are the gateway to sport. Diverse in geography and in event type, the net is thrown wide to engage and inspire those who stand to gain the most from participation. More than just a lift and a day away from problems, the networking and fellowship of the social and team focused events helps participants to connect with a wide range of support available through the Defence Recovery Capability and wider Service Charity network.

COMPETITION takes participation a stage further, given responsibility and learning goals, participants invest in an activity that can contribute towards a CV or be talked about at interview. Linked strongly with the charity's vocational output, 'Competition' is conducted towards agreed recovery goals to help participants improve their lot. In this way, sport can be an excellent vocational assessment and development tool.

level activity is conducted with outside support and sponsorship due to the higher unit cost of participation. This provides flagship events and activities that are a feed and a focus for entry level engagement, spreading the word, inspiring and encouraging wider participation.

In 2015-2016, Mission Motorsport delivered **562** Man Training Days (MTDs) of 'Experience' activity, ranging from trackdays to karting, and **391** MTDs of 'Competition', including the Defender Challenge series, and the flagship 'Race of Remembrance' event that celebrated its third year.

MISSION MOTORSPORT AND HELP FOR HEROES

Since that first trackday at Thruxton Circuit, Mission Motorsport has delivered over 3000 days of sport for the Wounded, Injured and Sick thanks to the support of Help for Heroes. Originally conceived to clarify and structure an area of Recovery Sport, Mission Motorsport's success has been due in no small part to the unstinting help from Help for Heroes. Spanning support to both H4H Sports Recovery and Career Recovery, Mission Motorsport's collaborative model has been enabled and encouraged and the two charities work closely together - with the beneficiaries' needs foremost. Together the charities look at the five key areas of an individual's life: medical, mind, body, spirit and family. In this way beneficiaries access support to the whole family to help them all cope with the challenges they face. Long-term recovery is more than repairing damaged bodies and minds; it's about rebuilding lives.



Training is a continual theme in the life of a sailor, soldier or airman because every operational deployment or tasking requires a new skill set; operational readiness is a fundamental condition. The transition to civilian life is no different and operational readiness translates to being 'work ready'.

For those leaving military service with medical issues the business of reskilling, or setting their military training into a civilian context is particularly hard. 'Transition' and the window of opportunity for training occurs as the individual is undergoing huge life changes. Students often have frequent medical appointments, mandatory military resettlement courses, and fragmented availability which prevents attendance on standard courses.

VEHICLE RESTORATION APPRENTICE VINNI MNGUNI HARD AT WORK ON THE MISSION

Recognising this, a proposal was put forward to work in partnership with City and Guilds, Help for Heroes and with support from the Royal Foundation of the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge and Prince Harry's Endeavour Fund to establish the Mission Motorsport Training Wing. The Training Wing was opened in 2015 by the Chairman of the Royal Foundation, Lord Janvrin to deliver tailored training that meets the unique needs of the audience – in effect, each student undertakes a bespoke course.

A City and Guilds Assessment Centre, the core course is the Level 3 Diploma in Light Vehicle Maintenance and Repair, but the Training Wing is no ordinary college. Course fees have been generously funded by Walking with The Wounded whose support has proved invaluable to 15 students in 2016 with a waiting list of applicants for 25 places in 2017.

"The training methods evolved rapidly at the start, adjusting to the unique needs of the beneficiaries, they can start the course at any time, fit attendance around their other commitments and progress at the rate that suits them. This makes Mission Motorsport utterly unique in the training world.

In the first year eight beneficiaries have gained the Level 3 Diploma, all have moved into rewarding new careers which have been truly life changing. We now have 15 beneficiaries in training who are all moving forward at their own pace, with ability varying from complete novice right through the spectrum to reasonably accomplished.

Seeing the transformation in these students has been truly inspiring for me, when they make the journey from broken and sometimes hopeless to being an accomplished technician with a bright career ahead of them I can't help but feel pride in what Mission Motorsport has done to help them achieve this transformation." - RALPH HOSIER, MM HEAD OF TRAINING

MAR STRINGER - ROYAL ANGLIAN - TRACK GROUP LTD

Former rifleman Matt Stringer is just one example. He saw action in two tours of Afghanistan and was medically discharged in 2013. Following a short MM brokered placement, we assisted Matt in attaining his HGV licence and securing employment with Track Group Limited as a race truckie. In late 2015 he began an accelerated apprenticeship attaining his City and Guilds NVQ Level 3 qualification with Mission Motorsport at the end of 2016; he enters 2017 fully employed as a race mechanic, still with Track Group, who have shown such faith in Matt and support from the beginning.





James joined the Army from school, and completed two tours of Afghanistan before constant joint pain saw him seek help for chronic early onset arthritis, exacerbated by his service. Aged 26, he was signed off to

be medically discharged from the Army and was being evaluated for a double hip replacement. He first engaged with Mission Motorsport through sport-drifting, 18 months with the charity has built his profile and CV with qualifications, spectacular project work and adaptive car builds. We are very proud that this led to full time employment with Jaguar Land Rover as a Production Supervisor with Special Vehicle Operations, and he remains closely engaged with the charity to lead, instruct, and inspire others. "It has helped me, massively, with the transition period. Mission Motorsport has presented me with wonderful opportunities that I would never have got before"

Simon Roxbee was discharged from the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers in 2001 after 10 years' service. In the last 15 years he has, like many servicemen and women, struggled with the transition to civilian

life and securing valuable, fulfilling employment. Early this year Simon sought assistance from the Help For Heroes 'Hidden Wounds' programme and was referred to Mission Motorsport. A weekend on Defender Challenge was his third event, and his desire to change his life was realised. Offered a job with Jaguar Land Rover, he has gone on to secure full time employment just around the corner from his home. Simon's view: "Mission Motorsport helped me find what I was missing since I left the military. They put me back on track". Huge congratulations to Simon, Rolls Royce have a fantastic new employee.

MISSION MOTORSPORT AND WALKING WITH THE WOUN

In 2013 MoD's Defence Recovery Capability, recognising the need for a specialist careers service to meet the needs of the WIS community created the Recovery Careers Service. Although only founded 12 months earlier Mission Motorsport was already pioneering vocational placements and was asked to become an integral part of this new service. Charitable funding came from the major service charities including Walking With The Wounded who recognised how critical the provision of vocational opportunity was to those facing the greatest barriers to employment. Mission Motorsport was delighted to be able to utilise that support through the provision of an embedded Relationship Manager, reaching out and brokering opportunities in the automotive industry and making these available to the entire community through the network of Specialist Employment Consultants. Over 100 opportunities were generated in the automotive sector, none of it possible without Walking With The Wounded's support.




VOCATION


In the last five years Mission Motorsport has built an exceptional network of partners willing to assist wounded, injured and sick personnel in their transition from military to civilian life. For average service leavers, leaving the services and establishing a second career is difficult enough but for those being medically discharged with mental or physical trauma the barriers to employment are greater still.

Insight visits and work placements have proved invaluable in enabling beneficiaries to discover how their skills sets can transfer to the civilian workplace. Over the last 5 years the charity has brokered over **200** work placements for service men and women in the automotive world - in industry, to test facilities in the Arctic to the pit lane at Le Mans. Every placement is arranged to give the individual the best possible experience, at no financial cost, with critical support throughout for those whose condition makes the seemingly very simple business of entering a new environment a major hurdle in its own right.

VINNIE MNGUNI - RIFLES -HISTORIT / BICESTER COLLEGE

A former Rifles soldier, Vinnie was signed off to be medically discharged with a back injury having been subjected to multiple IED blasts over two tours of Afghanistan. After engaging with Mission Motorsport, Vinnie was enrolled



on a Classic Vehicle Restoration Apprenticeship with support from Bicester Heritage, and spent the last two years working between Historit, High Tone and Bicester and Banbury College. Vinnie has completed the Level 2 qualification and is now engaged as a workshop technician at the College working towards his level 3, as well as working for Historit.

ISSISTANCE TO EMPLOYERS LASE STUDY JAGUAR LAND ROVER

In 2014 Mission Motorsport partnered with Jaguar Land Rover in order to help co-ordinate and drive aspects of Armed Forces Engagement Program taking forward their Corporate Covenant commitments. Mission Motorsport's embedded project manager working in Jaguar Land Rover has pioneered a number of initiatives, including the Wounded, Injured and Sick placement scheme.

To dates 33 placements have been completed, resulting in 21 contracts of employment with Jaguar Land Rover, and 4 in employment elsewhere.



MISSION MOTORSPORT AND THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION

Beyond the focus on those wounded, injured and sick, the practices that Mission Motorsport have employed have also directly benefitted a wide audience of veterans. For example, a focus on veteran employment, leveraging the work of the WIS placement scheme has seen Jaguar Land Rover employ some 488 service personnel since the initiative began in 2014. This work is being reinforced with the support of The Royal British Legion, adding depth to the Mission Motorsport vocational and administrative functions in order to make high quality opportunities available to a wider population of veterans.







IN WORK SUPPORT

The percentage of veterans who leave their first job within the first year are high, often due to misplacement and their own reorientation. Mission Motorsport's use of prior placement and insight reduces that likelihood considerably, but the charity's in work support both for beneficiary and employer continues. For those that move onwards, (or upwards), contact is maintained to help, even when situations have changed.

ASSISTANCE TO THE GRANT GIVING CHARITIES

As a member of The Confederation of British Service Charities, Mission Motorsport works collaboratively with the grant giving charities to channel funds helping veterans to secure financial support during transition. In 2016 Mission Motorsport enabled:

- £60,000 in employment support funding Lance Corporal Chris Read, Driver James Clark, Lance Corporal David Colman, Private Pa Nje each sponsored through MM and the Poppy Factory into full time employment.
- £22,500 in Vocational Support Grants to enable veterans to attend work placements and training opportunities.
- £10,000 in grants received for tooling for those entering the automotive industry, working with such iconic brands as Caterham and Triumph as well as motorsport teams.

MISSION MOTORSPORT AND BICESTER HERITAGE

On 8th January 2017, the launch of Mission Motorsport Heritage was announced at the classic car centre of excellence, Bicester Heritage in a new unit on the site of former RAF Bicester. Two beneficiaries had taken up the classic car restoration apprenticeship in association with Banbury and Bicester College and the Federation of Historic British Motor Vehicle Clubs with the support of Bicester Heritage. One of those, SAC Gareth Lloyd, ex-Royal Air Force, has suffered a deteriorating condition which has rendered him wheel chair bound and no longer able to pursue the apprenticeship in full. Undeterred, Gareth decided he would focus on those aspects of the industry that were accessible to him and, as a Mission Motorsport employee, is now developing a centre that will enable other beneficiaries to become fully engaged with the classic car industry.

"Without Mission Motorsport and Bicester Heritage I don't know where I would be. These two organisations have been a lifeline for me and I am so proud to be part of this new and exciting enterprise"



ASSISTANCE TO EMPLOYERS CASE STUDY DHL

Having signed the Corporate Covenant in 2014, global logistics company DHL approached their strategic partners Jaguar Land Rover to identify potential examples of best practice. The introduction made, Mission Motorsport placed Royal Artillery Sergeant Major Sean Reilly, then in transition himself, with DHL. Sean has 20 years of service, 6 of which have been spent in operational combat zones from Bosnia to Afghanistan, and has thrown himself into developing and implementing strategy. Sean is now the Military Liaison Manager at DHL, using the JLR/Mission Motorsport template, delivering a new programme of military recruitment and a WIS engagement program, supported by The Forces' Motorsport Charity.






Sean Reilly joined the Army in 1995, deploying on several tours of both the Balkans and the Middle East. Having been injured early in his career, Sean was later diagnosed with arthritis of the hips in 2013, undergoing numerous surgeries to correct the damage. Following his diagnosis and surgeries, Sean was in a dark place, and was suffering with deep depression and anxiety. Both family and work life suffered. Whilst on sick leave, Sean attended a Mission Motorsport open day, and was quickly put forward for a placement at DHL. He made quite the impression, and in February 2017, Sean started his new role as the Head of Military Engagement for DHL, where he is now able to help other military personnel find a new career in the civilian world. According to Sean, "without Mission Motorsport, I wouldn't know which way to turn. They have given me a new lease of life."



FINANCIAL

Since the outset, Mission Motorsport has enjoyed strong support from industry and partners, making our hard won charity money to go further. Every £1 donated is more than matched by a contribution in kind from industry. The charity's great value is in the work of the professional staff that it employs, embodying great expertise in helping service men and women successfully transition into civilian life. Over ¾ of Mission Motorsport staff are from a Service background, and are adept at providing that translation between military service and civilian life.





NE DE THOSE WE HELD



Alan Dennis was awarded a Conspicuous Gallantry Cross for actions in Afghanistan in 2010. He was referred to Mission Motorsport by the Defence Recovery Capability in 2014 and secured a placement in a logistics capacity at Formula E headquarters, three miles from his home. 'Big Al', like many, found transition difficult but is revered throughout the Formula E race series and now runs overseas parts and logistic operations for this global, groundbreaking race series. Al continues to be a leader of men, and was instrumental in Alex Fogg's success in one of the participating teams.

ALEX FOGG - ROYAL ENGINEERS - FARADAY FUTURE DRAGON RACING

Alex Fogg served in the Royal Engineers and was discharged after suffering with a heart condition. Like so many young soldiers whose military career has been prematurely terminated, he struggled to find gainful employment and a firm base. He was referred to Mission Motorsport by Help For Heroes and came to an open day where, within a week, he was on placement with Dragon Racing, a Donington Circuit based Formula E team. By the end of the second week, he had so impressed the Technical Director at Dragon that he secured a place on the team for the 2016/17 season. He has already got Hong Kong and Marrakech under his belt, and in between races he will be based at Mission Motorsport as a student on the NVQ Level 3 course in vehicle maintenance.



Matt Noakes first joined the Royal Marines from school, but returned to civilian life until rejoining his local Reserves Regiment, the Rifles, in his late twenties. He volunteered for an Afghanistan tour

in an infantry role, but was left injured, facing a lengthy rehabilitation having suffered a bad shoulder break during a firefight in the Green Zone in Helmand. Living in Crewe, he'd applied to Bentley Motors 13 times in 12 months without having received an acknowledgement. His life was at a standstill, and was at an incredibly low ebb. First attracted by a sporting offer, his quality was clear and he was put onto placement in Bentley by Mission Motorsport, and has secured employment there since 2012. He is still engaged with the charity, races and has mentored others to help follow his example. "Asking for help was one of the hardest things that I've ever had to do. Mission Motorsport have changed my life - the friendship and support that I've received has been unbelievable."
